#### From A Story To An Inquiry

October is going to be an exciting month where our focus changes from class room routines and expectations to the study of stories and an inquiry about bodies.

We will begin by reading, recalling, and dramatizing "The Ugly Duckling." This will be the second story we've studied carefully, and will help prepare the children for story acting. One by one they will sit with Jenn or Ann to narrate a story, which will be placed in their binders.

After, we will begin an inquiry about bodies. This is the focus because the children last year were fascinated by the body, brains, muscles, bones,

germs, immune systems

We will begin by finding out what we know. The children will be encouraged to share their ideas and stories. Then we'll create a focus by conduct-

ing observational drawings and crayon rubbings. After this we'll think about our questions and what our focus should be. We'll be seeking guest experts, and places to go for field visits-perhaps a Doctors' office or X-ray lab. Please let Ann know if you, grandparents, family members or friends may be interested in helping us with our learning.

The children REALLY LOVE INVOLVING THEIR PEOPLE in their studies! As we conduct our inquiry our information will be posted on the bulletin boards in the music room. Be sure to have a peek!

Possible inquiry focuses may be: how muscles work, skeleton construction, comparing animal & people

bodies, and understanding what occurs when a person gets sick and then recovers. This learning process will be exciting!

#### TELL ME ABOUT THIS!

The Child Study Centre Junior Kindergarten program honors social, emotional, academic, and physical learning.

SOCIALLY, the children have opportunity for share their ways of communicating, while learning about their classmate's and teachers'. In September, the children bring the social tools they have cultivated at home and in their communities to JK. Some skills are a perfect match, some need refining, and others need to be reserved for out of school. The goal of creating common social language is to make

school feel friendly and safe for all.

EMOTIONALLY a range of feelings are explored in the context of play, literature, and problem solving. Presently, we are practicing taking deep breaths when we feel agitated, excited, or frustrated. The children are also encouraged to ask for teacher help.

ACADEMIC skills and knowledge are cultivated in many ways. When studying literature and narrating stories, the children are developing their sense of story. When participating in an inquiry the

children research, question, speculate, wonder and study. The children are challenged to represent new understandings in a way that makes sense to them.

PHYSICAL skills are supported by having space for physical activity both inside and outside.

At JK, we try to balance teacher and self directed activities. Often the items your children bring home, have been created with care and attention. Saying, "Tell me about this" creates the children opportunity to share the important details that are

#### Dressing For Outdoor Play Every Tuesday and Wednesday

We LOVE the time we spend together outside in the courtyard. The courtyard is a beautiful space and lends itself to spontaneous games and taking time to admire the wonders of nature.

When we are in the yard, the children play on the grass and the pavement. We do not allow exploring in the garden, on the grates and rooftops. When there are many children and two

adults, the play needs restrictions to ensure safety. We acknowledge and respect these restrictions may not be the same when your family plays together, but ask you to respect them when in the courtyard.

The upcoming seasonal changes offer many opportunities to observe, infer, and learn about weather, animals, and ,the many forms water can take. Nature is SO EXCIT-

ING and we like to take opportunities to explore when it rains and snows. Thank you in advance for packing appropriate outdoor clothing and footwear for this.

Please note: When the temperature dips below -10C, we will stay indoors and the children will enjoy an indoor gym.

#### Last month at JK I learned so much! Now I can ...

During September we focused on creating a predictable, safe and friendly classroom community. Your children should be able to confidently show you that they can:

- -find and explain the visual calendar that lists the day's events
- -try to independently use the bathroom before JK
- -locate their names cards and explain that a name card indicates the place they should sit during circle time, and can be consulted when writing names
- -list the three class rules: walking feet, listening ears, and kind words
- -agree we work together to be safe and friendly while at Junior Kindergarten
- -recall the events of the story

- "The Rabbit and the Turtle"
- -make the sounds for /F/ and /T/ and *maybe* locate the letters T,t,F, and f in the environment
- -wave hello and goodbye to JK teachers
- -participate in a fire drill
