Possible inquiry focuses may be: how to mix colors, print making, studying the work of an illustrator, drawing people and pets, or art inspired by music. This learning process will be exciting!



The Child Study Centre Junior Kindergarten program honors social, emotional, academic, and physical learning.

SOCIALLY, the children have opportunity for share their ways of communicating, while learning about their classmates' and teachers'. In September, the children bring the social tools they have cultivated at home and in their communities to JK. Some skills are a perfect match, some need refining, and others need to be reserved for out of school. The goal of creating common social language is to make school feel friendly and safe for all.

EMOTIONALLY a range of feelings are explored in the context of play, literature, and problem solving. Presently, we are practicing taking deep breaths when we feel agitated, excited, or frustrated. The children are also encouraged to ask for teacher help.

ACADEMIC skills and knowledge are cultivated in many ways. When studying literature and narrating stories, the children are developing their sense of story. When participating in an inquiry the children research, question, speculate, wonder and study. The children are challenged to represent new understandings in a way that makes sense to them.

PHYSICAL skills are supported by having space for physical activity both inside and outside.

At JK, we try to balance teacher and self directed activities. Often the items your children bring home, have been created with care and attention. Saying, "Tell me about this" creates opportunity to share the significant and important details.

Dressing For Outdoor Play Every Monday and Wednesday


We LOVE the time we spend together outside in the courtyard. The courtyard is a beautiful space and lends itself to spontaneous games and taking time to admire the wonders of nature. adults, the play needs restrictions to ensure safety. We acknowledge and respect these restrictions may not be the same when your family plays together, but ask you to respect them when in the courtyard.

The upcoming seasonal changes offer many opportunities to observe, infer, and learn about weather, animals, and ,the many forms water can take. Nature is SO EXCIT- ING and we like to take opportunities to explore when it rains and snows. Thank you in advance for packing appropriate outdoor clothing and footwear for this.

Please note: When the temperature dips below -10C, we will stay indoors and the children will enjoy an indoor gym.
